One God in Trinity and Trinity in unity

One God

1. There is only one God (Gen 1:1, Deut 6:4)

Each person of the Trinity is God

- 2. The one Jesus called Father is God (Matt 5:6)
- 3. Jesus is God (Acts 16:25-34)
- 4. The Holy Spirit is God (Acts 5:3-4)

Each person of the Trinity is distinct

- 5. Jesus is not God the Father, God the Father is not Jesus (John 12:44)
- 6. The Holy Spirit is not Jesus, Jesus is not the Holy Spirit (Rom 8:26-27,34)
- 7. The Holy Spirit is not God the Father, God the Father is not the Holy Spirit (1 Cor 15:24)
- 8. Jesus is the Son of God the Father (1 Cor 15:24-28)
- 9. The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of the Father and the Spirit of the Son (John 14:16-25)

One God in Trinity, Trinity in Unity

10. The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are One (Matt 28:18-20)

Don't be embarrassed about the Trinity! Rejoice in your Triune God....

- The Triune God is and always has been personal!
- Other person centredness
 - Not-self-serving
 - Self-esteem, self-fulfilment, self-actualisation, self-protection, self-gratification
 - But other-person-centred serving!
 - For example: Mission, Prayer, Generosity, Love and Marriage,
 Pastoral care, serving in church...
