Read Together


God made boys and girls: Helping children understand the gift of gender by Marty Machowski.


Birds and Bees by the Book by Partricia Weerakoon.

This one is written for teenagerss to read for themselves, in ongoing conversation with their parents. It helpfully and frankly helps teenagers to grapple with the realities of adolescence, sexuality and gender in light of God's Word. Soaked in the Gospel, Patricia constantly points teens back to Jesus for the forgiveness and fulfillment we all need.

This book is aimed to equip parents to have pastoral conversations with their children about identity, sex and relationships from a Christian perspective. It is great for parents who might feel bewildered or anxious about the thought of talking to their children about sex or relationships.

Far more important than having the right books and reading them with your children is living in humble and zealous obedience to God's Word yourself. Our children learn as much, or even more from what they see in our lives than what we say and read to them. Paul's instruction to Timothy is true for parents as well: "Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers." (1 Tim 4:16).

Here's a prayer you might like to use for your children: "Gracious God, we thank you that through the death and resurrection of your Son, you have brought us from death to life. Enable us by your Spirit to resist the power of sin and give ourselves to you as a living sacrifice. May we not be conformed to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of our mind, so that we serve and please you in every way. We pray especially as parents, that you would give us a spirit of wisdom and love, that we may teach our children by word and example to follow Jesus. In our homes, give us the joy that comes from being faithful followers of the Lord Jesus Christ. Amen."
